LETTER FROM OUR RECTOR

Cobbles, a flat cap and a brass band - who of us can remember the Hovis TV adverts of the early 70's? It was not filmed in the northeast as the accent of the narrator might suggest, but on Gold Hill in Shaftesbury, Dorset. The original advert can still be viewed on YouTube. What an effective advert that people still remember it after more than 50 years!

Bread is a staple of many a mealtime, though of course it doesn't have to be Hovis. How many people continue to make their own bread, I wonder?



Indeed, bread has been a staple for millennia with frequent references to bread in the scriptures. Perhaps one of the most notable concerns the temptation Jesus faced in the wilderness to turn stones into bread after his forty day fast. The reality of temptation is a significant experience in all our lives and a theme which we visit each Lent. This year, Lent begins on 14th February, thereby elbowing out St Valentine!

The nature of the temptation to turn stones into bread, is in one sense about the quick fix and the short cut that takes little account of our God-given responsibilities. "By the sweat of your face you shall eat your bread" pronounces God in Genesis. Home-baked bread takes considerable effort to make, not least in the kneading of the dough if it is done traditionally by hand. Life itself, if it is to be lived with purpose and direction, requires our effort and dependence and trust in God, sometimes in all manner of challenging times and circumstances. 'Man shall not live by bread alone,' said Jesus in answer to the temptation, 'but by every word that proceeds from God's mouth'.

Another famous reference to bread in the scriptures is the miracle of the feeding of the five thousand. We demonstrate our trust in God by our generosity and kindness, like the young boy who donated his lunch that was blessed and multiplied. So, either by the offering of our time on behalf of a worthwhile cause or by a gift generously donated, let us express our thanks to God for all that He provides for us each day. One way we might give generously during this time, is by contributing to the Bishop of Norwich's Lent appeal for 2024, which will help to raise money to provide water tanks for Ordinand's Homes at Newton Theological College in Papua New Guinea.

However you journey through Lent this year, may you draw closer to God and trust faithfully in him.

Prayers and reflections for February

February can be a difficult month. Christmas and the New Year are over; spring is still a long way off and the days are still short and cold. I find that in February it seems that winter is here to stay. Nevertheless, there is one thing about February that always cheers me – and that is the snowdrops. For me, they are a sign that no matter how cold and miserable the weather, spring will come, and all the other colourful bulbs will follow, the days will lengthen, and the sun will shine again. So, this month's readings are about hope...

Read: I will say of the Lord, "He is my refuge and my fortress, my God in whom I trust". *Psalm 91:2.*

Ponder: When the world batters us, we need a safe refuge and God promises that whatever we face, he is with us and will help us if we trust in him. Words of hope when things are difficult.

Pray: Father, I know you are always with me even though I cannot see you; help me to trust you when things go wrong and to rely on your love to see me through. Amen.

Read: "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you a hope and a future."

Jeremiah 29:11.

Ponder: What good news to know that God loves us and has our best interests at heart.

Pray: Father, thank you that your plans for us are good and that we can know hope through good and bad times. Amen.

Read: We have this hope as an anchor for the soul, firm and secure. *Hebrews* 6:19.

Ponder: Ships need an anchor let down into the mud to secure them when storms come, and our souls need an anchor too, that will keep us secure. If we are rooted and anchored in God, then we need not be anxious or afraid.

Pray: Father, keep me safe on my life's journey through this world. Be my anchor so that I may look to the future with hope and not fear. Amen.

Read: Yet this I call to mind and therefore I have hope: Because of the Lord's great love we are not consumed, for his compassions never fail. They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness. *Lamentations3:21-23.* **Ponder:** With every new day, God is with us, and his love is patient and constant. With God at our side, we face each new day, knowing that if we fail, he never will fail us or desert us.

Pray: Father, be with me each new day; may I know your love surrounding me and encouraging me. Help me to step out in faith and hope to meet whatever comes. Amen.


