LETTER FROM OUR RECTOR

Travelling from one destination to another, or from A to B as we sometimes say, is made easier these days with the advent of the smart phone and interactive maps. Type in point A and then your destination - point B, and the digital technology behind the map will speedily work out the most efficient route to take you there.

However, I'm sure most of us can remember the days before Google Maps, when we had to use printed maps which needed a little more effort but which, in some ways, were more rewarding to use, once you



were able to read them accurately. Indeed, I remember the joy I had as a young teenager, learning how to read an OS map in geography lessons, learning not just the route but all the (literal) ups and downs too, as one noted the contours along the route. Map reading is still a worthwhile skill to learn. However, for a map to be useful, it has to be accurate if it is to guide us to our destination.

The story is told of the tourist who visited St Petersburg (or Leningrad, as it was then) during the days when Russia was part of the Communist USSR with its staunch anti-God philosophy. The tourist used a map to navigate his sightseeing tour. However, what he saw on the map didn't fit with what he saw in front of his own eyes – several huge Russian Orthodox churches. They weren't on the map and yet, he was certain he knew which street he was on. 'Ah', said the soviet tourist guide accompanying him, 'we don't show churches on our maps!' Of course, the reason for this was purely ideological and somewhat confusing.

As we journey through our lives, we need a map to guide us, and we need a map that will give us an accurate route for the journey we need to take, or better, we need wisdom for our lives which will help us to see things as they really are, and not misdirect us by false and misleading ideologies.

The Christian conviction is that the Bible as the Word of God, is the trusted and tested map we need as a guide on our journey through life. A guide that gives us a true assessment of our journey and does not mislead us. The Christian's conviction is that we also have Jesus as our guide, who has travelled this route before us and knows the way. He is the one who has come into the world as a light and who will guide us along the route to God's eternal city.




