DECEMBER MINISTER'S LETTER

Christmas and New Year: a time for joy and celebration! A season, also, to take stock, to look back at the year that has passed and ahead to the year to come. However, there is much that is currently taking place, especially at an international and global level, that can make it very difficult to maintain a sense of gratitude for all that has been, a sense of joy for all that is, and a sense of excitement for all that will be.



While we may find some comfort in the familiar traditions of Christmas and New Year such as family meals, present-giving and fireworks, there is a greater encouragement to be found at this time of year in the form of our community. Despite our increasingly individualistic society, community remains an enormously valuable part of our lives, but only if it is fostered and invested in. Each of us is a part of our shared community and at this time of year, there are plenty of opportunities to come together.

The twelve-day festival of Christmas tells us a familiar story, one which we have likely heard many times before, but we love to hear a good story again and again, because stories are at the heart of communities and this particular story has community at its heart. Christmas tells of how God came to be in communion with creation and how, at the nativity of that communion, people from different backgrounds, cultures and communities were overjoyed at the Good News of God's love being with us. That same warmth of love is still offered to us today, and it is the passion of the local church to provide time and space in which we can come together as a community to rejoice in that love. You are therefore, warmly invited to your church's services and events this Christmas season and beyond.

So much in our society and in our fractured world can have the effect of deepening existing divisions between people, framing our differences as negative, and enflaming our anxieties. We may therefore, need to work harder to remind ourselves of our common humanity in order to preserve our sense of community. Perhaps, the deepest of all shared human experience is the need to be loved, which is why Christmas, a celebration of God's love for each of us, is such a wonderful opportunity for us to rejoice as a community. It is in communal living, in the encouragement and building-up of one another, that we find divisions are bridged, barriers are torn down, and a culture of love is born within our midst.

May God's blessing be poured out on our communal life this Christmas, that together we may experience renewed thankfulness, joyfulness and hope in all that we hold dear. A very Merry Christmas and a Happy New year to you all.

Ponder: In his coming to earth, Jesus was a symbol of light and life in all its fulness. Today, he still brings light and life in all its fulness to us as we seek to find our way in this troubled world.

Pray: Loving God, as Jesus came to bring light and life to all, help us to open our hearts to him this Christmas, and shine your light through us to the world around us. Amen.

Week 3: For to us a child is born, to us a child is given, and the government will be on his shoulders.

Isaiah 9: 6

Ponder: In the Incarnation, God gives himself to us as a child, but a child who will change the world and who will bring goodness, justice and peace to all.

Pray: Loving God, You give yourself to us with generosity; thank you that we do not need to earn or deserve your love, but just to receive it and in that, to receive your son, Jesus – child grown to man – who died and rose again. Amen.

Week 4: The light shines in the darkness, but the darkness has not understood it...The true light, that gives light to every man, was coming into the world.

John 1: 5 & 9

Ponder: There is much darkness in our world today; what comfort that God's light still shines in the darkest places in the world and in our lives and is available for everyone.

Pray: Loving God, bring your light to darkness wherever it reigns. Bring your light and peace to the world; bring your light and peace to our lives and our hearts, through Jesus our Lord. Amen.


