LETTER FROM OUR RECTOR

Two thousand years ago, or thereabouts, a man entered Jerusalem on a donkey. He was accompanied by his followers who were so excited by his entry into the city that they treated him to royal acclamation and tributes. They spread celebratory palm branches and some even their own cloaks beneath his feet and shouted their praise at the top of their voices. Their praise of God and of this man stirred the whole city. Many asked what was happening and 'who this man was'. 'This is Jesus the prophet from Nazareth in Galilee', replied his excited followers.



Like so many of Israel's prophets before him, Jesus knew that neither he nor his message would be welcome in Jerusalem. Jerusalem was a very religious city with the temple standing at its heart as the centre of Israelite worship. Yet for all that, many could not accept the ministry of the man who came so humbly and meekly into their midst, with the promise that God desired to forgive and heal their past rebellion and wrongdoing, if only they would turn from it all and put their trust in him.

The pride and jealousy of those with power and influence meant that their eyes and ears were closed to the message he brought. A few days later, an opportunity came to destroy him. With great irony, on the holiest day of their religious calendar, they handed him over to the Roman forces of occupation as a troublemaker and an enemy of Rome - his fate was sealed. His life was exchanged for that of a terrorist who was released by the Roman governor as a gesture of forever tarnished 'good will'.

Using their most barbaric and demeaning form of execution, the Roman authorities stripped him naked and nailed him by his hands and feet to a splinter ridden cross and lifting it upright, they mocked him and gloated over his suffering and death. Yet, with the final few words from his mouth, he prayed for the forgiveness of all those who conspired against him and he yielded his life to trust in God, crying out, 'It is finished.' A tomb close by was his final resting place on that day but this was not the end of the story.

Three days later, when the most loyal of his followers revisited the tomb, they found it empty, except for the grave clothes neatly folded in one corner with a young man on one side. 'You are looking for Jesus the Nazarene who was crucified', he said. 'He has risen! He is not here'. Sure enough, for many days after this the risen Jesus showed himself alive to many.

It is this incredible story, that has transformed the lives and given courage and hope to millions of people, from the 1st century and down through the ages. Countless people have had their lives changed forever, transformed by the hope of eternal life by meeting for themselves, Jesus who is alive. This Easter, we will celebrate his resurrection with great joy in our hearts. Please join us and listen to this story of wonderful good news and joy.

This event is not intended just for women, but is meant as a gift from the Christian women of Palestine to Christians the world over. The theme is "I beg you bear with one another in love."


