NOVEMBER MINISTER'S LETTER

November is a month of remembering, firstly through the observation of All Saints day when we celebrate those who have gone before us as disciples of Christ, then All Souls day when we remember loved ones departed. After these comes Remembrance Sunday and Remembrance Day, occasions on which we commemorate the armistice signed to cease hostilities at the conclusion of the Great War, and a time when we honour the memory of those who have given their lives in the service and defence of others.



While the word *remember* literally means to be mindful of again, it can also evoke a notion of re-membering, a putting back together of something fragmented or a coming together of many parts which had previously been united. The times in which we are currently living are times of increasingly fragmented society and deepening divisions between people. The act of remembering is of course to do with recalling the past, but the real value of memory is to be found in how we allow it to impact our present. It is up to us then, to decide whether we live lives that will perpetuate the divisions of our present days, or lives that seek to re-member that which is fragmented.

In honouring the memory of those who have given their lives in the hope of a united and peaceful world, remembering the past is only half the story. We must also strive to re-member the present, to build the world that those who have gone before us longed to see. Practically, this involves working to heal wounds, tear down barriers and build bridges, fostering relationships between ourselves which are based not only upon the virtues of empathy, tolerance and understanding, but which are rooted in a real love for one another.

Jesus said 'this is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends.' In a world where so often the focus is upon looking after our own individual interests, and where our own opinions are all that matters, Jesus shows us a different way, a way which prioritises the other. If we all had each other's best interests at heart and adopted a greater willingness to see the world through each other's eyes, we will surely start to build a tomorrow which will truly honour those who gave their today.

Pray: Gracious God, always, you remember me. Teach me to remember you. Amen.

Remembering the poor

Read: All they asked was that we should continue to remember the poor: precisely what I was determined to do.

Galatians 2: 10

Ask yourself: How far do you see concern for the poor as fundamental to the gospel? In what ways can you, and do you meaningfully express that concern?

Pray: Lord Jesus Christ, who became poor for my sake, teach me, having so much, to remember the many who have so little, and in responding to them, may I respond to you. Amen.

Lest we forget

Read: We have heard for ourselves, O God, our predecessors have told us the deed you performed in their time, how in bygone days you saved us from our enemies.

Psalm 44: 1, 7

Ask yourself: Do you forget sometimes how much you owe to those who fought for the freedom of this country? Why do we need to remember, and what lessons can we learn?

Pray: Living God, teach me to remember the lessons of the past, so that I may appreciate the present and work always for a better future, in the name of Christ. Amen.

Anna Sewell's "Black Beauty"



On the 28th November 1877, Jarrold & Sons bought the rights to Anna Sewell's book, 'Black Beauty'. Anna Sewell was born on March 30th 1820, in Great Yarmouth, Norfolk. At the age of 14, Anna Sewell had an accident which injured both her ankles. Unfortunately, she never recovered and was unable to walk or stand for long periods of time for the rest of her life. She gained a sense of freedom through horses, often driving her father on a horse and trap to the station for his commute. Her own limitations and dependence on horses for mobility gave her a great respect for them, and the drive to bring awareness of the cruel working conditions some of them were put under.

The novel was presented from the first-person perspective of 'Black Beauty', and was written in such a style as to encourage the reader to relate to the horses in the novel, and sympathise with their plight. Although it is now thought of as a children's classic, originally it was written for adults.

The novel was written over 6 years, during which time Anna Sewell's health was rapidly declining, with her often being bed-bound and being reliant on the care of her mother. Five months after her book was published, she succumbed to her illness, just long enough to see her book become a success. She died at Old Catton on the 25th April 1878 (at 58 years of age) of hepatitis and tuberculosis. There is no doubt the book influenced anti-cruelty reforms and improved conditions for horses. In 2003, the BBC listed 'Black Beauty' as No.58 in 'The Big Read', their survey to find the nation's best-loved novel of all time.
